



Lenguaje del Español y Literatura 1

- First course in 4-year sequence
- Followed by Lenguaje del Español y Literatura 2, AP Spanish Language, and AP Spanish Literature
- More focused on biliteracy and bilingualism than Spanish World Language courses, 100% in Spanish
- Greater emphasis on reading and writing in Spanish
- Supports students in learning content in Spanish
- May earn dual credit at Portland Community College

Lenguaje del Español y Literatura 1&2 and AP Spanish are students' World Language courses. Students planning to attend a four-year college or university should complete the minimum requirement of two or more years of high school study in the same World Language.




Biología

- College prep course, surveys biological topics
- Emphasis on concepts and hands-on labs
- Units and curriculum the same as Biology course in English
- Biology is the 9th grade science course
- Students earn science credit
- Taught by teachers who revised the course to meet Next Generation Science Standards
- This course is one of three recommended high school science courses and it prepares students for higher level courses.



Pillars of Dual Language Education





Why Stay in Dual Language in High School?

Middle School

Develop bilingual and biliteracy skills through intensive language focus in Spanish LA and social studies. Deepen cultural understanding of world cultures and their contributions.

High School

Strengthen literacy and language skills so students can learn content in Spanish in chosen subjects successfully, prepare for jobs and careers where being bilingual is beneficial, have advanced language learning on high school transcripts, earn the Biliteracy Seal and gain cultural competency.

Primary School

Begin growing vocabulary and understanding through listening, speaking, reading and writing while learning content in language arts and math. Learn language and cultural differences and to appreciate and understand them.



Research Findings: Benefits of Continuing Dual Language in High School

- Students in DL continue to make greater gains in reading skills, especially with increasingly complex texts, than those in English only classes. (4-year large random study in Portland Public Schools)
- Greater participation in school, better attendance, higher levels of attention to school work and engagement in activities in DL students than non-DL students, through high school. (Study across 37 states, Thomas & Collier, 2020)
- Dual language students in high school show greater understanding and interest in students different from themselves and cultures different from their own. (Lindholm-Leary, 2009; Thomas, Collier & Collier, 2010)
- Continued daily interaction and study in two languages promotes greater attention, ability to focus, perception of patterns and working memory. (Bialystok, Craik, and Luk, 2008)

- Forecast with all 9th graders.
- Select Lenguaje del Español y Literatura.
 (With advice of 8th grade DL teacher, may take Lang. & Lit. II)
- Select Biología.





Plan for High School Dual Language

- Add two Dual Language courses each school year for a total of 8 courses when our first cohort students are seniors.
- Added courses will be core classes, arts courses and in Career Technical Education (CTE).
- Each high school will add courses based on student interest, staffing and an effort to balance across core, arts and CTE.
- Other high school students will be invited and encouraged to take Dual Language courses as their Spanish language skills allow.
- Future course examples: Latin American Studies, Medical Translation, Music & Dance, Journalism & Media, Foreign Affairs, Spanish Art Forms, Early Childhood Learning in DL
