## Sexual Violence Prevention<sup>1</sup>

Addressing the root causes of violence in our society

Sexual health inequities are eliminated.

Sexual Health Promotion<sup>2</sup>

Developing interventions for young people who show risk factors for becoming perpetrators

Youth use accurate information and well-developed skills to make thoughtful choices about relationships and sexual health.

Rates of unintended pregnancy are reduced.

Empowering those who witness violence (bystanders) to speak out Promoting the status of all genders Promoting healthy and safe attitudes and beliefs about sexuality Young people experience their sexuality as a natural and positive element of maturation.

Every family has access to, and ability to utilize, formal services and supports without fear of stigma Non-consensual sexual behaviors are reduced.

> Rates of sexually transmitted infections are reduced.
