
The Oregon School Report Card provides additional information. Boones Ferry's Overall State Rating of 4 indicates

Boones Ferry is synonymous with strong community. We look forward to collaborating with you to grow the greatest thinkers and most thoughtful people for the world.





Level 1 = Falls into the bottom 5% of schools


Level 2 = Falls between 5% and 15% of schools
